

# Study of gambling and health in Victoria

## Table games



### What is the study?

The Victorian prevalence study 2014 is a telephone survey of 13,554 Victorian adults who were selected randomly from the general population. There were 12,551 surveys using landlines and 1003 using mobile telephones. The study aimed to explore gambling and problem gambling in the Victorian population.

### Past-year participation in table games

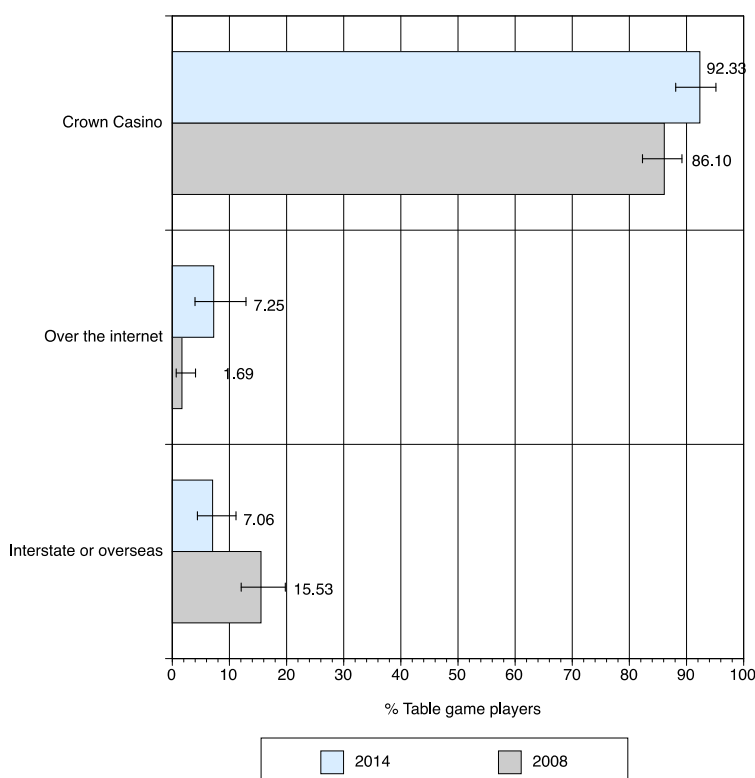
An estimated 5.05 per cent of Victorian adults reported betting on table games in the previous 12 months. This included games like blackjack, roulette and poker.

There was no statistically significant change in adult participation in table games since 2008.\*

### Locations of table game play

The top locations where players bet on table games in the past 12 months were:

- Crown Casino (92.33 per cent)
- over the internet (7.25 per cent)
- interstate or overseas (7.06 per cent).



### Comparisons with 2008

Since 2008, there was a:

- significant increase in the percentage of people playing at Crown Casino (from 86.10 per cent to 92.33 per cent)
- significant increase in internet table game play (from 1.69 per cent to 7.25 per cent)
- significant decrease in table game play interstate or overseas (from 15.53 per cent to 7.06 per cent).

### Gender of table game players

Around 72.40 per cent of table game players were male and 27.60 per cent were female.

### Age of table game players

Age group	Proportion of table game players (%)
18 to 24	27.72
25 to 34	29.94
35 to 44	16.25
45 to 54	7.89
55 to 64	4.62
65 and older	13.58

\* Although mobiles were not included in the survey sampling in 2008
